



## Adelphi band to perform at state inaugural

The Adelphi Community Band will achieve a first Monday in Columbus.

The 106-year-old group will perform at the public reception in honor of Gov. Richard F. Celeste, Lt. Gov.-elect Paul R. Leonard and their families after the two men take their oaths of office in the morning.

There is no charge for the public reception which is from 2 to 4 p.m. on the 24th and 25th floors of the new One Columbus building, Broad and High streets. The Adelphi band has been asked, through the Democratic organization, to play for a half-hour, starting at 2:45.

According to Herman Hinton, director, the group's program will be a mixture of brass band music, including "Colonel Bogey," "Stars and Stripes Forever," "Happy Days Are Here Again," and "Beautiful Ohio."

Hinton said a chartered bus will carry the 21 men, representing Ross, Hocking, Pickaway, Fairfield and Pike counties, to Columbus.

This is the first time the band has been asked to perform at a state inaugural, but it was one of five Ohio bands nominated to play during President's Reagan's inaugural festivities last January. Hinton said the band'also performed at Port Columbus airport when Hubert Humphrey made a stop there as a vice presidential candidate.

The inaugural ceremony will be held on the west steps of the State House at 11:30 a.m. There will be a receiving line in the State House Rotunda, starting at 12:45. These activities also are free and open to the public.

The festivities will wind up with an inaugural ball from 8 p.m. to midnight at Veterans Memorial, 300 W. Broad St. Information on tickets (\$30 per person) is available by calling Nancy Sully at the Inaugural Charity Celebration, 1-228-5125.
