the Lord Dunmore Treaty was signed in October 1774. It was this treaty which brought temporary peace between the Whites and the Indians.

Logan Elm Park is administered by the Ohio Historical Society, located about 7 miles south of Circleville and about 1 mile off R. 23. Parking and picnic facilities are available.
