

### More, Bigger Prizes to Mark Gala Halloween

#### Cash Awards to Go To Mummies, Floats, Marching Units, Etc.

More and bigger prizes than ever offered before will be awarded participants in the annual community Halloween celebration Wednesday, Oct. 31.

Members of the planning committee, following a meeting Tuesday, announced that cash awards will be offered the five best floats from marching units, four groups of mummies and other individual contestants.

#### \$15 For Queens

Miss Bon County to be chosen from high school beauty queens will receive a first prize of \$15. The two members of her court will receive \$10 and \$7.50 respectively with a \$5 award to be made to each non-winner.

This portion of the program will be handled by the Business and Professional Women's club, with Mrs. Helen Greenhouse as chairman.

Prizes for the best floats range in value from \$25 to \$2.50 with \$12.50 offered for second place.

Marching units will receive awards of \$20, \$10, \$7.50 and \$5 respectively for first to fourth place. All entrants in these two categories must register on or before Friday, Oct. 26 by calling at or phoning the Chamber of Commerce office.

#### Prizes For Mummies

Three prizes of \$10, \$5 and \$2.50 each will be awarded top contestants in the mummies parade. The most comic, most beautiful and most unusual. Prizes of \$5 and \$2.50 will be given the mummy judged as the most characteristic.

In addition to these awards, 100 silver dollars will be distributed to mummies wearing outstanding costumes who are not judged winners in the classified categories.

#### Bands Invited

Bands that have been invited to participate in the parade are the Frankfort, Bimbsbridge, Chillicothe, Waverly and Leasville high school bands, the Hallsville-Adelphi community band, and the American Legion Drum and Bugle Corps of Chillicothe.

The parade will move at 7:30 p. m. from city park and travel over the same route as used during past years. All units have been advised to assemble at 6:30 p. m. in order to receive a number and be able to qualify for prizes.

Before the parade, concert of 15 minutes will be given by high school bands at Leasville high school, from in front of the courthouse and at second and First streets.

Window painting contests for deep discounts of the houses and senior high schools will be conducted on the same afternoon. By the Junior Civic League of Chillicothe with Mrs. William Dimity and Mrs. Robert Powell as co-chairmen. Five money has been donated by the Retail Merchants Association and C. L. Ohio National Guards. Three first prizes of \$10 and three second prizes of \$5 will be awarded.
