Hundreds of Young Musicians In Music Festival

DOZEN BANDS SCHEDULED TO PLAY OCT. 22

Big Feature of Pumpkin Show Will Be Free To General Public

Big free band festival with hundreds of youthful musicians in more than a dozen central Ohio school bands taking part will be one of the featured features of the 14th annual four-day Pumpkin Show which is scheduled Oct. 22-25 in Circleville.

The band festival, as directed by Dan McClain, will be held at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday, Oct. 22, on the Circleville High school athletic field, and it was announced Tuesday that the participating bands will include the winner known as the piece Columbus West High school band.

McClain said no admission will be charged at the band festival which will not be in the nature of a contest and no prize will be awarded.

THE BANDS will be grouped in two classes. In the Class A will be the 108-piece Columbus West High band, the 108-piece Chillicothe High band, the 108-piece Lancaster High band, the 108-piece Washington C. H. High band, the Jackson High band, and the Circleville High band. In Class B will be the Ash Grove High band, and the recently organized All-Country band.

The various bands will march in a parade at 4:30 p. m. and will then proceed to the band festival which will be held in the afternoon at the "Little Miss Pumpkin Show," which will be chosen from among girls in the first three elementary grades in schools of the Circleville area.

That music will give a vital part in the 1947 Pumpkin Show can be readily noted from the band program.

THE LIBERTY Union band of 22 members will be the featured band in the parade, and it will be accompanied by a drum corps of 20 members.

That band and also the Greenfield High school band will appear in the parade which is to be held Thursday night immediately following the selection of Miss Pumpkin Show of 1947.

The "Homestead" quartet and "Little Miss Pumpkin Show" will lead the procession.

At 1:30 p. m. Friday, Oct. 24, the Lancaster Army Air Base band will present a concert on a platform at Court and Main streets. At 4 p. m. Friday the Columbus band will play at Court and Main streets. At 8 p. m. Friday the annual Pumpkin Show parade will pass through downtown Circleville.
