Faure Relaxes After Victory Assembly

PARIS (P-Twice victor in National Assembly votes on his North African policies, Premier Faure appeared able today to look forward to a month's respite from

parliamentary attack. He won his latest victory last night with a 308-254 vote of conf' dence from the Assembly on his

plans for restoring order and promoting political reforms in Algeria. The 54-vote margin surprised

even his supporters.

Nine days earlier he had carried off an even more surprising 477-140 endorsement of his Moroccan policies

Each time, he came back from what* looked like certain defeat, Each time he benefited from sp(4 cial circumstances, but his own nimble parliamentary footwork also contributed to success.

With the two voting hurdles behind him, Faure now should be able to concentrate on applying the reform program: for Morocco and which the Assembly ap-Algeria proved.

Faure's troubles were far from over, however. A big segment of his support has slipped away from him and his enemies are waiting only for an opportune moment to give him he ax. He get a number of votes yesterday from deputies who announced they opposed his policies but hesitated to plunge into another government now.
