

Circleville wins squash weigh-in

CIRCLEVILLE — Circleville squashed Half Moon Bay, Calif., Wednesday in a squash weigh-in at the Circleville Pumpkin Show.

The winner was a 340-pound Hungarian Orange squash grown by Ralph Dreiback of Circleville. Waupaca, Wis., took second place in squash competition with a 322 1/2-pound squash grown by Ed Ziebell.

Half Moon Bay, however, did have the largest pumpkin, a 297 1/4-pound Big Max. Circleville's Big Max entry weighed 137 pounds.

"It has been a contested issue since 1976," said Michele Morrison, of the festival committee. "They call a Big Max a pumpkin; we say it's a squash."

Ian Parsons, weigh master of England's pumpkin association, said his country has a simple answer to the disagreement between Circleville and Half Moon Bay, "In England all squash are called pumpkins."

A Zane Trace High School junior, Kelly Holdren, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Mike Holdren, Route 4, was chosen first runner-up in the Pumpkin Show queen contest Wednesday night. Carol Moore, a Circleville High School junior, was chosen queen of this year's show. She is the daughter of Mrs. Kathryn Moore, Circleville. Second runner-up was Sandra Drummond, a senior at Westfall High School and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dave Drummond, Route 1, Clarksburg.

Wendy Williams, a first grader at Alwood Elementary School, was chosen Little Miss Pumpkin Show.
