Sharon Allen Chosen Miss Laurelville

Parttime newsgirl, Sharon K. Allen, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Allen, Laurelville, was last night selected Miss Laurelville at the third annual Laurelville Volunteer Fire Department festival.

Miss Allen will represent Laurelville in the Miss Pumpkin Show contest which will be held opening night of the Circleville 52nd annual Pumpkin Show from October 15 through 18.

The Laurelville senior was chosen from among eight contestants representing the four high school grades of Laurelville High School. First attendant was Miss Garnetha Meenach, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Meenach, Route 2, Laurelville.

Second attendant was Miss Ada Harmon, 15, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Harmon, Route 2, Laurelville. The beauty contest was the kickoff of the four day annual Laurelville street carnival.

WINNER ALLEN is a three year Laurelville High School cheerleader and a member of the National Honor Society. This was her first year in the event. Miss Meenach, a junior, was selected as first attendant for the second consecutive year.

Miss Harmon is a Laurelville sophomore and was competing for the first time in the contest. Entrants in the beauty event were from the Laurelville and Adelphi area.

Other contestants were high school freshmen, Carol Hartley and Connie Delong; sophomore Janet Reid; junior Betty McCain, and senior Betty Hunt. Master of ceremonies was Dr. Edgar Kelly, local dentist.

Judges for the event were David Crawford, 443 1/2 N. Court St., Circleville councilman; C. K. "Bill" Vaughan, Arbor Road, president of the Circleville Chamber of Commerce; Hiram Hatcher, 122 Seyfert Ave., and James I. Smith III, 458 E. Main St., Herald reporter. Last year's queen, Sue Ellen Good, crowned the 1958 queen and her attendants.

The Laurelville festival is sponsored by the local volunteer firemen's organization to raise money for equipment. Tonight a Spin-the-Hoop contest will be held.

Saturday there will be a parade at 5 p. m. with the Laurelville and Centralia High School bands and the Adelphi Community band participating.

Prizes of \$20, \$10 and \$5 will be awarded the best floats and prizes of \$10, \$5 and \$2.50 will be presented to the best paraded horses in the Saturday parade.

The festival was headed up by fire chief, Hugh Poling; assistant fire chiefs, Robert Thompson and Orville Kempton; secretary-treasurer, Franklin Strous, and organization president, Dwight Eveland. Saturday afternoon all rides will be cheaper.
