# Halloween committee lists times for parade judging

Theme of the city's 1969 Halloween parade will be "Moonlight Special" as the parade returns to a night time schedule and salutes the recent moonwalk by Apollo astronauts.

Judging times for various entries in the parade Oct. 29 were finalized during a meeting of the Halloween Parade committee Wednesday evening. Floats will be judged beginning at 6 p.m. Judging will take place at No. 1 ball diamond. Mummies will be judged at the armory beginning at 7 p.m. and marching units competing for prizes will be judged at 6:30 p.m. at the tennis court near the city parking lot.

All Divisions will be formed south of the armory this year. Division I will form on Tritscheller Drive in front of the armory, Division II on Enderlin Circle in front of No. 1 diamond, Division III in the city parking lot and Division IV on Riverside Street.

James Scott will direct float and marching unit judging; James Grandstaff will be in charge of communications; Deputy Sheriff Wendell Counts and Police Captain Andrew Wade, traffic control; and Arthur Fisher will provide judges for the queen contest.

The local Naval Reserve unit will provide the color guard for the advance unit this year, and the Adelphi Band will provide music.

If the judging area on No. 1 ball diamond becomes crowded, units will be taken to Bolmer Field for judging.

Robert Barnhart suggested that bicyclists be kept from riding their bikes in circles on West Second street near the speaker's platform. The committee decided to place all bicycles in the parade in a single unit.
