

Nine Bands and 27 Floats Set For Halloween

Entries for Biggest Parade Must Be In By Thursday, Oct. 29

With nine bands, plus 27 floats and marching units lined up, the Chillicothe Community Halloween committee is making good its promise that this year's celebration Saturday night, Oct. 31, will be the "biggest and best" ever.

The floats and marching units will be loaned to groups representing the activities of the city and county, with commercial and public activities being carried out by the committee.

\$300 Still Needed

While the committee needs \$300 to meet its expense goal, prior \$1.50 entries for floats and marching units have been increased over \$1.00 last year by 115 per cent and the number of individual and feature floats has been upped by 50 per cent.

Participants will have a choice of driving one of three floats: 10 custom, namely 10 beautiful, 12 new custom or used, and 13 custom float.

Awards in each are identical, \$25 for first place, \$20 for second, \$15 for third, \$10 for fourth and \$5 for fifth. In addition, a beauty contest will be held. Entries will be presented in the most outstanding of all entries.

Judges are to be provided by the men's service clubs, Kiwanis, Lions and Rotary. They will be asked to determine the winners. Entries to receive consideration will include originality, appropriateness, symmetry, workmanship, showmanship and other qualifications.

Individuals or groups wishing to participate may call the Chamber of Commerce, 2-5126, during the day of look-seeing, 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the evenings, Thursday, Oct. 28, in the auditorium for entries.

Some New Entries

Among recent entries are cheer leaders from the Central High School, Delta Sigma, Kappa Kappa Gamma, and the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Mt. and Mt. Carmel girls, the Blue Jay, Kappa Kappa Gamma, the Blue Jay, Kappa Kappa Gamma, the United States Shoe Corporation. The last two named are not competing for prizes. Club Edgewood Service will provide a 30-man marching unit, color and other floats. Blue Jay Varsity will provide a 30-man marching unit. The Blue Jay Varsity float will present the spirit of the local factory.

Participation by Boy Scout units promises to be quite extensive. Through William Hildebrand, activities chairman, all groups will be entered, including a contingent from First Base of Engineers Post 12, Lawrence House of Park 4, Wade Stewart of Troop 8, Sherman Landman of Troop 10 and Vernon Stewart of Troop 8.

The band list includes the following: Chillicothe High School, Chillicothe Jr. Cadet Band, Southwestern High School Band, Parkview High School Band, Adelphi Band, Lincoln High School Band, Circleville High School Band, Parkview High School Band from Bourne, and the Varsity Administration Band.
