A BAND concert at 1 p. m. started Saturday's program at Court and Main streets. It was given by the South Solon High school band.

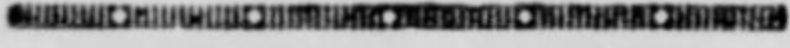
