Over 150 units entered in parade

More than 150 units are entered in the 1969 Halloween Parade, which gets under way at 8 p.m. Wednesday.

Sponsored by the Chillicothe Area Chamber of Commerce and Evening Lions Club, the parade will form in Yoctangee Park and move west on Water Street to Walnut Street, south to Second, back east to Mulberry, north on Mulberry to Water Street and back to Paint Street, where it will disband.

Floats entered in competition should be in place in Yoctangee Park by 6 p.m., according to William Hamm, parade marshal. Marching units will be judged at 6:30 p.m. and mummers will be judged at the armory at 7 p.m.

All divisions will be assembled between the armory and Riverside Street.

Parade participants will be directed to their divisions by members of the Evening Lions Club or other parade officials.

The Adelphi Band will present a concert on the steps of the Ross County Courthouse at 7:30 p.m. and then move to Yoctangee Park to lead the parade.

Don Head and Robert Barnhart will emcee the parade from the speaker's stand at Paint and Second Streets.

Queen contestants and parade officials will be treated to donuts and coffee at the Gas Company office following the parade.
