

# Halloween Parade Will Be 'Largest Ever,' Says Moore

Merton A. Moore, grand marshal for Chillicothe's 28th annual Halloween Parade scheduled for Wednesday, announced the line-up of-march Monday for the gala event.

Thirteen musical organizations, 24 floats, 18 queens, 36 marching units and 8-10 cars, along with a parade of mummies will make this, according to Mr. Moore, one of the largest parades in the event's history.

Parade participants, Mr. Moore said, are to report to Yocetangee Park—via the Mulberry Street entrance—no later than 6 p.m. Floats and marching units will be judged in the park prior to the parade which is slated to move out at 7:30 p.m. sharp.

**'Fattest Man' Now Weighs 1,041 Pounds**  
FISHHOOK, Ill. (AP) — Robert Earl Hughes, who claims to be the world's fattest man, has returned home from a summer tour with a circus nearly 100 pounds heavier.

Because of his great bulk, the 30-year-old Hughes gets weighed only infrequently. For scaling purposes, he usually is brought to commercial scales in Fishhook aboard a truck from his farm home near his town in west central Illinois.

The last time Hughes was weighed he tipped the scales at 945 pounds. Brought to town several days ago after his summer stint with the circus, Hughes now weighed 1,041 pounds, a net gain of 95 over his previous bulk.

Other members of Hughes' family, including his father and two brothers, are average size persons.
