

Halloween Event To Be Best Ever

Merton A. Moore, a grand marshal for Thursday's 56th annual Chillicothe Halloween parade grand total of 165 entries will be in line of march when the gala extravaganza moves out of Yoctangee Park at 8 p. m.

The four divisions making up the parade will feature 17 bands, 15 queens, including 11 candidates for the Miss Ross County title, 19 delegations of cheerleaders, 29 marching units, two motorcycle clubs, five equestrian units, high wheel and tandem bicycles, and 29 marching units.

Also included in the line of march will be the mummers, the exact number of whom is not yet known since they are not required to register until the evening of the parade.

With a little help from the weatherman, Mr. Moore predicts, the parade will be the largest yet.

Follow Old Route

The parade will follow the same route as in recent years—emerging from Yoctangee Park at Paint Street, turning east on Water to Mulberry; south on Mulberry to Main; west on Main Street to Paint and north on Paint to Water where the line of march disbands.

Division One will form on the hill leading from the Park to Paint Street; Division Two along the north side of West Water; Division Three on East Water and Division Four in the Park alongside the parking lot and No. 1 softball diamond.

Wider Pawnee Rd. OK With County

Ross County Commissioners, during a session Monday, approved the widening of Pawnee Road at its junction with Route 23, provided the Scioto Township trustees absorb the cost.

The proposal is a part of the plan for the erection of a traffic light at the intersection, already approved by the State Highway Department.

A delegation of Zane Addition residents appeared to discuss Zane Plaza, informed commissioners that an application has been submitted for another light which is expected to be placed at the main entrance to the shopping center.

Both lights were said to be needed because of traffic congestion in the area. Residents and shoppers have difficulty in gaining access or egress at the sites. Both lights are to be traffic activated, it was re-
