## New Features Added To Livestock Parade

The Parade of Champions, the traditional livestock parade held at the picturesque racetrack at the foot of historic Mt. Pleasant on Saturday during Fairfield County Fair week, will have some new attractions this year, according to John Ricketts, fair board member in charge of the parade.

In recognition of Bert Moyer's long years of service as a Fair Board

member, he and his wife have been named grand marshals and will ride in the parade, which begins at 10:30 a.m. Bert, a 30-year member of the Fair board, has been in charge of the standard bred horse races, along with Ricketts, for as many years. Bert noted that he had showed stock at the Fairfield County Fair since 1918.

Also riding in the parade, probably in a horse-drawn vehicle, will be Pickerington's Senior Citizen of the Year in Ohio, Violet Huntwork, also installed last summer in the Ohio Senior Citizen Hall of Fame.

In addition, six area queens and princesses representing beef, pork, wool, soya, 4-H Horse Club and Junior Fair categories will ride in the parade in horse-drawn vehicles.

Prior to the hour-long parade, the Fairfield County 4-H Fads square dancing group and the Adelphi Band will perform from 10-10:30 a.m., another new feature for the long-standing livestock parade event.

The Parade of Champions includes livestock of all species as well as draft and pleasure horses.
