## Beef Slaughtering Totals Listed As Lowest In Last Eight Years

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5.—Agriculture Department officials reported today that fewer cattle are being slaughtered in 1951 than at any time in the last eight years.

The sharp decline in beef cattle slaughter is taking place despite the fact that the nation's farms and ranches have close to a record total of cattle this year, and will have still more previous records by January.

Officials said most cattle from these two states have gone to pastures, ranges and feedlots elsewhere, rather than directly to slaughter.

They report that good pastures and the threat of salt have encouraged a few marketings from central and northern range areas and West pastures this year.

All in all, total slaughter, including that on farms from January through September, was probably twelve and a half to thirteen million head. A large fourth quarter slaughter would give 18 million head at the most in the early part of World War II.

Recent indications show that Americans are eating less every other kind of meat this year, but if an expected seasonal increase in Fall marketings comes through, the 1951 total meat consumption per person will about equal last year's 147 pounds.
