HISTORY DAY CELEBRATION AT LOGAN ELM A SUCCESS

More than 2,000 persons from this and adjoining cities, counties and states, attended the Ohio History Day celebration Sunday, at Logan Elm Park. This celebration is sponsored by the Ohio History Day Association of which Mrs. Howard Jones is president; J. F. Carlyle, of Columbus is vice-president; Mrs. Mary Leist, treasurer, and Miss Agnes Butch, secretary, with an executive board composed of H. G. Stevenson, R. L. Bremer, C. C. Chappellear, Miss Butch, Mrs. Leist, Mrs. Orion King, Mrs. H. M. Crites and Mrs. Anna Chandler.

The program opened at 2 o'clock at the park with invocation by Rev. E. S. Toenamer of the Presbyterian church, followed by an address of welcome by Mayor B. T. Hedges.

After the salute to the flag and "The Star Spangled Banner" played by the Adelphi Band, this flag was presented to Mrs. Jones for the Association by George Bareis of Canal Winchester.

LINDLEY SPEAKS

Harlow Lindley of the Ohio State Archaeological and Historical Society of Columbus, in his remarks spoke on the advantages of the Ohio Museum, why it was used, how it was used and by whom used it, saying that it was intended to have a certain day set apart for each city or town adjoining Columbus at which time these guests would be given special attention. Sunday, Oct. 19, is Circleville day.

The address of the day was given by Randolph Walton, of Columbus, and his subject, "The Shawnee Indian," was very well covered. He told of their life, manners and customs, and also described the Battle of Ft. Pleasant. He paid very high tribute to Chief Logan, Chief Cornstalk and to Tecumseh. He read a speech of Tecumseh's and a letter written by Tecumseh to General Harrison. In his talk Mr. Walton brought out a great number of points generally overlooked by the ordinary speaker. He stated that the present home of the Shawnee tribe was in Oklahoma.

Music for the celebration was furnished by the Adelphi Band. The parking of over 400 automobiles was very competently handled by H. G. Stevenson, and Sheriff Davis and his deputies took care of the traffic.
