## New Display

Among the new displays will be one set up by the Rural-Urban Committee of the Lancaster Area Chamber of Commerce—in a tent on the midway east of the cattle-barn. The exhibit is illustrated with photographs taken throughout the county showing farm facilities, a series of posters highlighting statistics on farm income, costs of production, number and size of farms in the county.
