THE PLATFORM, which will be operated by Harold Anderson and Richard Huggins, in addition to being a control point for parades, will be a center for band concerts and record hops each evening.

A total of 54 musical units will appear during the Pumpkin Show in addition to seven drill units.

The Circleville High School Band will make five appearances; Amanda-Clearcreek will make two; Malta McConnellsville will make two; Kingston will make two; Alensville and the Adelphi Community Bands will also make two appearances each.

Each parade will feature 35 floats. The Little Miss Pumpkin Show Parade will have eight marching units in addition to the Little Miss entries.

The Miss Pumpkin Show Parade on Wednesday evening will have 13 musical units, plus the floats and contestants. Other parades throughout the show will have a similar number of musical units, floats and plenty of competition.

The remainder of this week and the beginning of next week will be spent making final preparations for the Pumpkin Show by a great percentage of Pickaway Countians.

Shea commented today that everyone can participate in one or more phases of the 1963 Pumpkin Show, regardless of age or handicap. Competition is being offered in everything from the "prettiest baby" to the "best hog caller," he added.
