Thirty units sign for Halloween Parade

Thirty units have registered for the Chillicothe Halloween Parade, set for 8 p.m. Oct. 29. To date there are 12 bands, two floats, five marching units, four queens, a baton twirling group, commercial float, color guard and several cheerleader groups. Judges for the queen contest, division captains, and judging categories were announced at the Wednesday meeting of the Halloween committee at the Chamber of Commerce office. William Hamm, 14 Zander Drive, will be parade marshal; Paul Miller, 10 Zander Drive, will lead division I; Wayne Shupe, 58 North Fork Drive, division II; William J. Brown, 686 Ervm Avenue, division III; and Robert Smith, 37 Limestone Blvd., division IV. Judges for the queen contest will be Lyle Beham, Dayton, Lions District Governor; Harold Spitzer, Cedarville mayor; and Dan W. Cole, Marietta, also a former district governor. Judging categories will be mummies, floats and marching units. Mummies, regardless of age, will be judged on beauty, comic appearance, originality and grotesque appearance. Prizes will range from \$10 for first place to \$2 for sixth place. Float categories will be original, community service for youth, community service for adults, religious and special. The special category replaces the beauty classification and will be for out-of-county floats only. The most outstanding float categories have been dropped this year. Prizes range from \$25 for first place floats to \$5 for fifth place floats. Marching units will be judged on appearance, precision and originality. Prizes will range from \$15 for first to \$3 for fourth place. All officials of the parade will wear ribbons with the word "Committee" on them, and several Lions will wear red coats with the club emblem, for easy recognition by parade participants. The reviewing stand area at Paint and Second Streets will be lighted by the Columbus & Southern Ohio Electric Co. and installed by the fire department and city electrician. The Veterans Administration Hospital will furnish the reviewing stand, chairs and a public address system. The sheriff's office will be responsible for traffic and parade control in Yocantage Park, and city police will handle the crowd and traffic along the parade route. The Chillicothe High School Band will probably appear at the beginning and end of the parade. The Antique Auto Club of Southern Ohio will provide 15 or more cars for the parade. Parade officials and queen contestants will be invited to the Gas Company office following the parade for refreshments. Hoffman American Legion auxiliary.
