THE HAUL MADE BY THE BURGLARS.

County Treasurer M. F. Partee returned Tuesday evening from Adelphi where he was called by the robbery of his store on Monday night.

He reports that the burglars wrenched a shutter off of the window of his store and effected an entrance there. Nothing was taken by them from him, but a gold watch valued at \$14, a gold pen and holder and a gold tooth pick. From Mr. Patterson's store, which is also the post-office they obtained from the safe \$16 belonging to the Adelphi band, and about \$35 belonging to the Building and Loan Co. They opened the registered mail and from three letters mailed that evening by Mr. John Dresback took \$48. Several others not from the Adelphi office contained unknown sums. Stamps, postal cards etc. to the amount of \$33 were taken. They were unable to get the money orders because they were kept in a small burglar proof apartment within the safe, and had not time to open that. Some Sunday school money in envelopes was overlooked by them, but a pair of gold glasses belonging to Mrs. Paterson was taken. While the balance of the stock was overturned nothing else was taken as the burglars evidently only wanted money or something easily convertible to money.

Absolutely no trace of them has been found outside of what was stated Tuesday. They made good their escape.
