Laurelville Area Leader Arthur Hinton, 72, Dies

Arthur Hinton, 72, a member of the Logan-Hocking County District Library Board and an active figure in Laurelville area civic affairs, died at 1:30 a.m. today after suffering an apparent heart attack at his Laurelville Rt. 2 home.

Retired, he had served for five years as superintendent of the Centralia (now Zane Trace) School District, in which he taught for 42 years. He was a member of the board of directors of the Salt Creek Valley Bank, Laurelville.

A graduate of Salt Creek High School and a 1933 graduate of Ohio University, he was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church of Laurelville. He served as chairman of the church's board and was a former Sunday School superintendent for 20 years.

Hinton was a member of the Adelphi Masonic Lodge, F&AM; Scottish Rite, Aladdin Temple Shrine, the Aladdin Shrine Band and a 50-year member of the Adelphi Community Band.

Born April 15, 1902, in Colerain Twp., Ross County, son of the late Willard E. and Bertha A. DeLong Hinton, he was married Aug. 18, 1925, to the former Thelma Hart, who survives.

Also surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Ramon (Nancy) Maxson of Laurelville Rt. 2; a son, Ned Allen Hinton of Lancaster; three grandchildren; four brothers, John of Laurelville Rt. 1, Lloyd of Chillicothe Rt. 4, Herman of Kingston Rt. 2 and Curtis of Laurelville Rt. 2, and three sisters, Mrs. Ethel Pontious of Amanda, Mrs. Paul Strous of Adelphi and Mrs. John Turner of Lancaster.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Trinity United Methodist Church, Laurelville, with the Rev. Jacob Lehman officiating. Burial will be in Green Summit Cemetery, Adelphi.
