

Loyalty Paraders to Step To Music by Adelphi Band

Chillicothe Jaycees have finally succeeded in lining up a band for Saturday's Loyalty Day observance.

The Adelphi Community Band, consisting of about 25 members and directed by Rod Shaw of Lancaster, will be the lone band among 19 units parading through downtown Chillicothe.

The parade's participants will meet from 2:30 and 3 p.m. in Yoctangee Park to get in proper position. The parade is scheduled to start at 3:30 p.m.

The route will be the same as that of the Halloween parade. The units march from the park to Paint Street then east on Water to Mulberry, south on Mulberry to Main, west on Main to Paint, and north on Paint to

Water Street where the parade will be disbanded.

Immediately following the parade will be ceremonies in front of the courthouse.

The Rev. Norman Ramp will give the invocation. Following will be speeches by Jack Manson, an Ohio Jaycee State vice president from Chillicothe, John Herrnstein of the Philadelphia Phillies baseball team, and Dr. Lewis Goorey of Columbus, national director of the Ohio Jaycees.

Dr. Goorey will be followed by Warren Hines and Donald Brown, respective commanders of the VFW and American Legion, County Commissioner John W. Mecker and Mayor Charles Fair.

The parade will be led by the Chillicothe Police, and followed by Sheriff's Department, State Highway Patrol, VFW Post 108, American Legion Post 62, Chillicothe Fire Department, Marine Corps League, and American Legion Women's Auxiliary.

Then will follow the Adelphi band, Boy Scouts, Ross County Civil Defense, Red Cross, Carverettes marching unit, National Guard Company A of the 216th Engineers Battalion, Army Reserves, Salvation Army, Civil Air Patrol, and the Ross County Junior Deputy Sheriff League.

Facilities for the speakers platform are being supplied by the VA Hospital. The Chillicothe Lions Club will fly flags in the downtown area.
