Soft cashmere woolen cloth of tan, on which narrow brown lines make a cross-bar design, is the material used for this smart coat sketched above.

The nutria makes a shallow yoke which extends into sleeves, and also into a slender line at the front, which narrows as it reaches the border of the coat. Unlike many coats of the season, this border is placed several inches above the hemline.

This fur trimming would also be effective on a jacket of shorter length worn with a cloth skirt to match.
