"Tune In", Big Broadcast Comedy At High School, Brings Out 1,055 Auditors; Directors Are Lauded

TNT with a "W" in front of it became a radio station laugh explosion Tuesday evening at the Arch street auditorium when Chillicothe High School students starred in "Tune In". Don Wilson's two-act musical comedy.

Crack comedy lines, splendid dancing and music with a punch—that was the radio show that delighted the 1,055 persons who came to see and hear the 85 young people so ably directed by Miss Mabel Lawler, supervisor of public school music and Mr. Charles Duncan of the high school faculty.

The play opens an hour before the Kroggins broadcast, when Kasper Kroggins, the codfish king, is arranging details, which are complicated by his ambitious, uneducated wife, whose sudden wealth has inspired her with the desire to sing before the radio audience. Her blunders in English and attempts at singing keep the audience in continual amusement.

Mitzi Makes Good

The situation is complicated when Mitzi, switchboard operator, is substituted before the microphone, and makes good.

In the second act, complications are unravelled at the Kroggins' New Year's eve masquerade party, when announcement is made of the great wealth that has accrued through the successful Kroggins broadcasts of Mitzi; and Mrs. Kroggins declares that she always has been a home-body anyway, and really never wanted a career.

Each actor portrayed his role so capably it would be difficult to single out any. It was an exceedingly well-balanced cast.

Dancing Pleases

The dancing added much to the play, that of the solo dancers, Mary Ann Heasentahler, Beatrice Ware and Marjorie Ferrell being done in expert manner, while the specialty dance by nine girls was well received. The dancers included Shirley Ann Frey, Mary Ann Koch, Helen Fetherolf, Betty O'Bryant, Harriet Rittenour, Beatrice Hollis, Betty Smith, Marjory Augustus and Marjory Comstock.
