Kemp, of Jackson, who had been teaching in Chillicothe schools for about nine years.

He was a member of the Presbyterian church, Indianapolis. His brother, Robert Franklin Huff, a sergeant-musician with the 2nd Replacement Depot band in Tunisia, was wounded there when a Bob Hope camp show was bombed by German planes on July 10, 1943, and he died in Veterans' hospital, Indianapolis, on June 6, 1945. His late father, a widely known band music composer, was at various times director of the I.O.O.F. and 20th Century bands here.

In addition to his mother and the brother, William L., other survivors are two sisters, Mrs. Robert L. Clark, 85 North High street, and Miss Marjorie Huff, 250 West Water street, and another brother, Wilbur, a trumpet player in a Cincinnati theater orchestra.
