Antique Forum Set

Roscoe Village in Columbus will host its fourth annual Antique Forum on March 20. The morning session which will begin at 10 a.m. and will consist of a museum tour and a show held at the Johnson Hamrickhouse Museum (now located across from the Venter Center in Roscoe Village).

The Johnson Hamrickhouse Museum originated from a turn of the century bequest to the city of Columbus by David M. and John H. Johnson.

Extensive collections of art and artifacts from many cultures were first brought together in the old Swainmore School building, in a section and opened to the public on May 6, 1961.

In 1978 a new site in historic Roscoe Village was selected as an ideal location in which the collections could be seen and enjoyed by much larger audiences. An extensive collection of oriental art objects will be of particular interest to forum attendees.

Museum personnel will be on hand to assist forum participants as they view the American, Indian, Celtic and Oriental collections. Mounted in the Manigomers gallery will be a collection of wood-block Japanese prints owned by the museum and never before shown.

Advance registration for the Forum will be accepted on a first come, first served basis by sending name, address, telephone number and \$10 per person to Antique Forum, Roscoe Village Foundation, 301 Hill St., Columbus. The fee includes morning coffee and rolls, museum tour, clinic, luncheon at the old Warehouse Restaurant and afternoon lecture.
