With 7th Annual Festival**

**Mr. Squire's Baton Waves 138 Young Artists On
To The Stage At High School Auditorium**

MUSIC that traveled all the way from the little tots' go at "Mary Had A Little Lamb" to high school soloists' offering of Beethoven's sonata bore out all the advance claims for the public schools' seventh annual music festival, Tuesday night, at the Chillicothe High School auditorium.

"Two Guitars", a Gypsy Folk Song, played by Donald Williams on the clarinet, and accompanied by Mr. Squire, delighted also.
