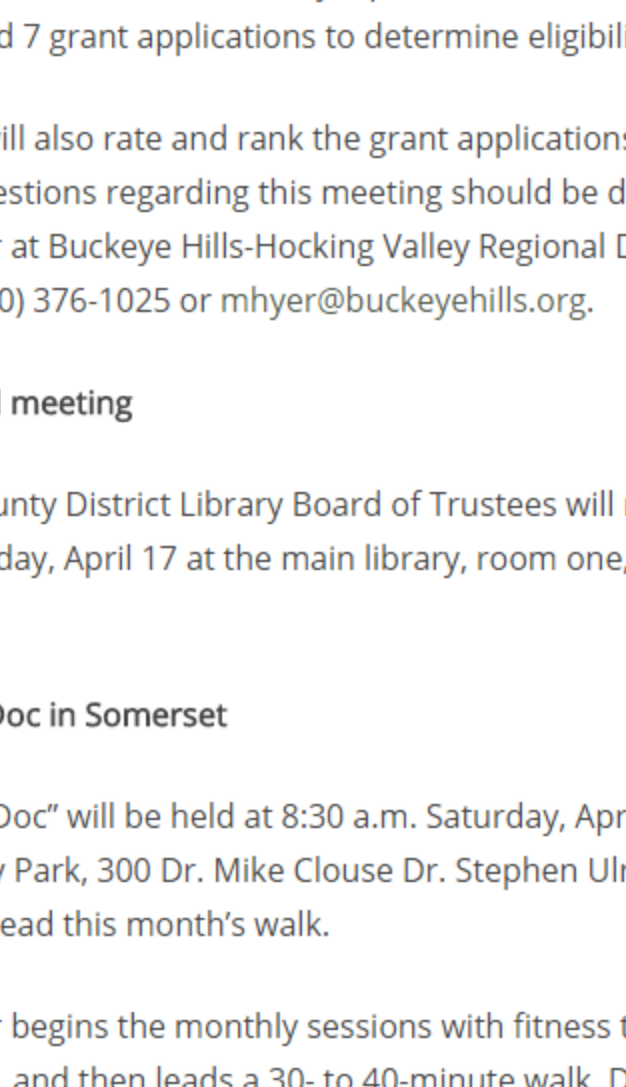

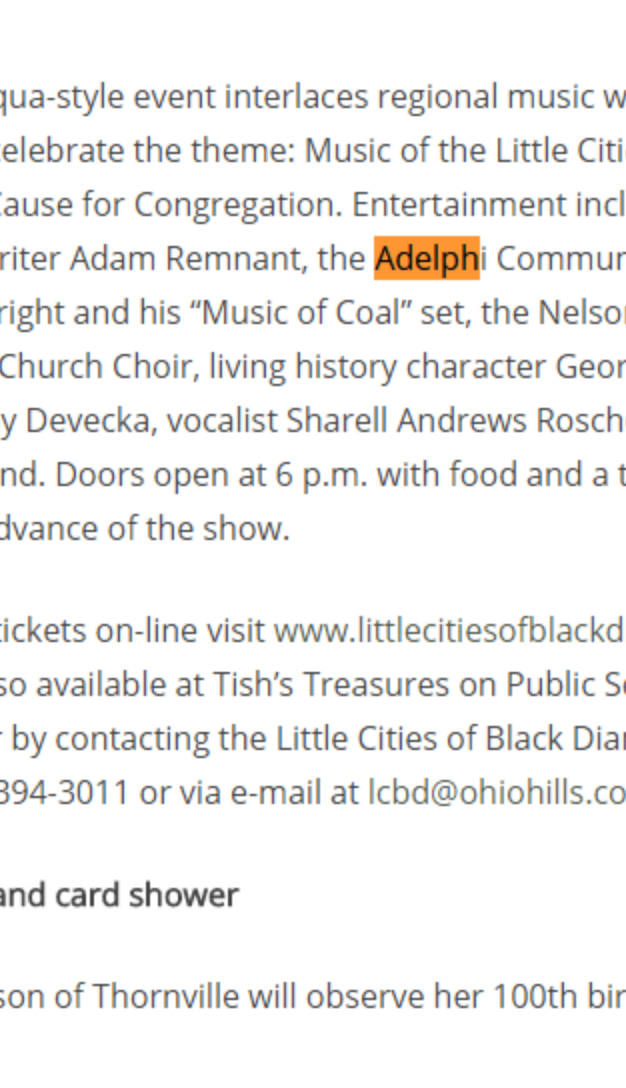

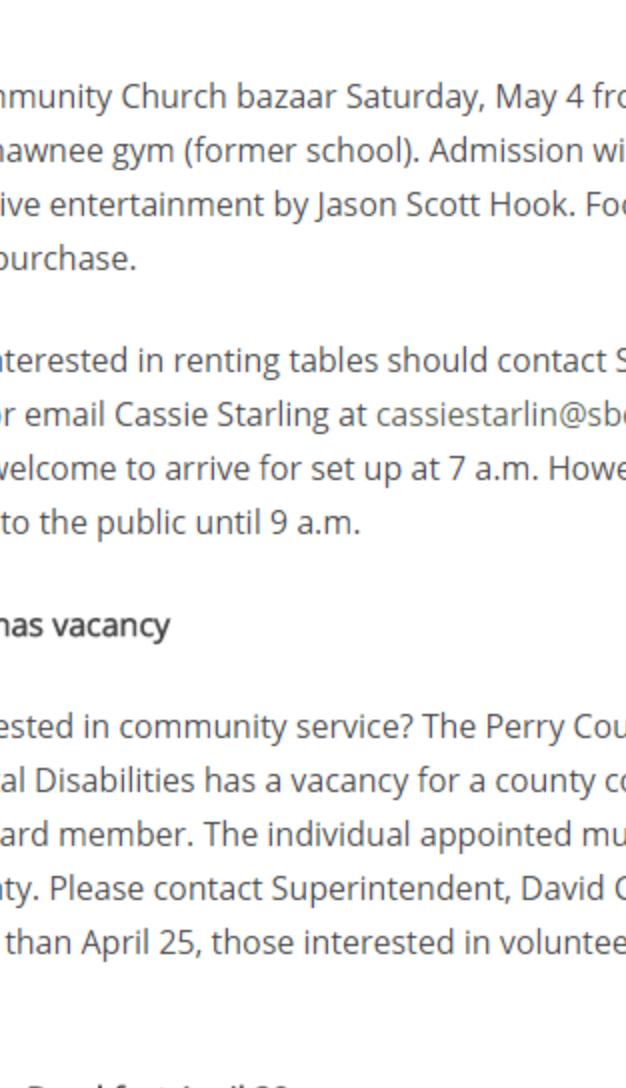
Benefit round and square dance
