

OPERETTA GREETED BY CAPACITY HOUSE

"PINAFORE" GIVEN BY HIGH SCHOOL IN FINE PERFORMANCE.

A capacity house greeted the seventy high school students who presented the two-act comic opera, "H. M. S. Pinafore" by Gilbert and Sullivan, which was presented at the High School auditorium Friday evening.

The operetta was directed by Miss Mabel Lawler, school music supervisor and Mr. Charles Duncan of the High School faculty, both of whom have gained enviable reputations for careful, thoroughgoing training of the students whom they have heretofore presented in public performance, which was amply sustained Friday evening.

The operetta moved along smoothly, all lines being delivered without the slightest hesitation. The setting was perfect, and represented the quarter deck of an honest-to-goodness liner.

Miss Lawler has the happy faculty of uncovering good voices among the students under her care, and the principals of the Friday night cast numbered several, which were outstanding, although all were good. Marguerite Black, Anne Haney and Margaret Bets among the girls being especially good.

The chorus numbering fifty one, was of full volume and did excellent work. They presented a very attractive appearance, the boys in sailor suits and the girls in the dress of the 1850's, hoopskirts and all. The costuming of all the cast was unusually attractive.

The special dance numbers directed by Miss Thelma Fallstrant, assisted by Betty Higley were unusually snappy and graceful and elicited much applause.
