

TICKET SALE FOR PAGEANT TO OPEN SOON

Plan For 4500 Seats At
Herrstein Field
May 8th, 9th

Sale of tickets for the Northwest Territory pageant, "As the Years Unfold", to be presented May 8th and 9th at the Chillicothe high school stadium, will open Monday morning in the schools of Ross county and at the celebration headquarters next to the court house.

There will be available at the football field, 4,500 seats for each night of the performance, and 1,500 persons who will appear in the pageant of Ross county's history will be given accommodations in nearby buildings.

A block of choice seats will be sold only at celebration headquarters for 75 cents each and will carry their own reservations.

In advance sales, tickets for adults will be sold for 25 cents each. After May 2nd, they will cost 35 cents each. These adult tickets may be reserved at headquarters for 15 cents each, between May 2nd and 7th.

Children's tickets, when sold in advance, will cost 10 cents and after May 2nd the price will be raised to 15 cents. Reserved seat tickets may not be obtained to match children's tickets.

A picture of the first capitol of Ohio will be printed on the tickets so that they may be of value as souvenirs. Tickets will be punched but not torn when offered at the Herrstein Field gates.

In charge of sales is Mr. Richard Schachne, jr., general chairman. Mr. James W. Blair will contact men's groups; Mrs. William Allyn will provide tickets for women's groups; Mr. M. M. Berry, city public school sales; Mr. A. E. Gover, county school sales; Miss Rosemary Schachtel, St. Mary's parochial school; Mrs. Ed. Schneider, St. Peter's parochial school; Mr. Paul Smithson, gate sales; and Mr. Edwin H. Caron, sales in downtown Chillicothe.
