

Antique car show Sunday at Piketon Dogwood Festival

PIKETON — Thirty-six trophies for first and second places in 18 classes will be awarded at 3:30 p.m. Sunday following the Dogwood Festival antique car show and parade.

Registration will be from 9 a.m.-noon at the Piketon High School football field, followed by the 1 p.m. grand parade. Cars which meet requirements for more than one class will be assigned to the first applicable class on the list.
