Dogwood Festival parade Sunday

PIKETON—Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Patterson, lifelong residents of Pike County, will be honorary marshals of the 1 p.m. Sunday Dogwood Festival parade in Piketon.

Both are descended from Pike pioneer families. Mrs. Patterson, the former Helen Moore of near Waverly, and Mr. Patterson, who farmed and operated a feed and grain mill in Piketon for many years, have been married for 59 years.

Wilder Weinrich, parade chairman, will be assisted by Jim Brushart and Dick Radford. Weinrich reported the registration indicates the largest parade to date for the four-year-old Festival.

The line of march past the reviewing stand at the Activities Center:

A color guard from the John Sanders American Legion Post at Piketon, Piketon High School Band, more than 60 antique automobiles, Waverly High School Band, Southern Ohio Corvette Club, police, county Emergency Medical Services and fire departments vehicles.

The Adelphi Band, floats—including the Fall Festival of Leaves queen and court, and the Kingston Geranium Festival queen and court, 44 members of The Columbus Children's College Marching Coeds—drill unit from Chillicothe, Girl and Boy Scout troops from Pike and Ross Counties, the Pike-ettes drill team, horsedrawn vehicles, mounted groups including 4-H clubs, the Piketon Saddle Club and individuals.

Weinrich said no bicycles or motorcycles will be permitted in the parade, which will form in and around the Piketon High School campus in time to march out at 1 p.m. A trophy, donated by Dr. and Mrs. Mack E. Moore of Piketon, will be given for the best float, the chairman said.
