Bainbridge buildings to be demolished

BAINBRIDGE - Bainbridge Council members discussed the demolition of three buildings on Main Street to make way for a new community center.

Contracts for the demolition will be let after the original owners have removed all possessions from the building, according to Gertrude Scott, clerk.

The village has purchased four lots on Main Street for the new center. One building will not be torn down.

The council also discussed the progress of the village's water and sewerage projects.

Water from a test well, drilled last summer, is being analyzed before final plans are drawn for a new water plant.

The plant will be designed to deal with the particular chemicals in the water. The sewage project is waiting on federal money," Mrs. Scott said.
