FINE PERFORMANCE OF CONCERT MUSIC

GIVEN AT ARCH STREET HIGH SCHOOL THURSDAY, DIRECTED BY MR. SQUIRE.

The fourth annual festival concert of the Chillicothe Public Schools, under the capable direction of Mr. Russel Squire, presented last evening at the Arch Street High School Auditorium, to an almost filled audience was a fine performance and showed much improvement over last year's concert.

One hundred and twenty-five pupils of the grade, junior high and senior high schools took part in the program, which began at eight o'clock. The evening's entertainment opened with a group of four numbers played by the Junior High and Grade Schools' Orchestra, followed by the High School Orchestra playing five numbers. The Boys' Glee Club sang a negro spiritual, Peter by the Sea, and O'Hara's "A Little Close Harmony." Both numbers were splendidly given and the audience applauded generously. The boys' quartet, composed of Milford Ater, Rudolph Griesheimer, George Barman and Edwin Black sang "It's the Three Leaves of Shamrock" Daly, accompanied by Mr. Squire. Edwin Black sang the verse part. This number was especially pretty and showed fine training.

The concluding part of the program included a group of nine numbers, played by the High School Band, the one number composed by Mr. Squire, "Chillicothe Pep Song" and Goldman's "On the Mall" and the last two march numbers, U. S. Field Artillery and El Capitan by Sousa were the best in that group and all especially well done. The time to these numbers were perfect.

The performance was indeed a

credible one and a notable success. Mr. Squire is to be praised for his fine work achieved in building up a splendid orchestra in the High School.

The proceeds for the affair will go towards the purchase of a new piano.
