## Fellowship Hears Sauer Talk on Korea

Robert Sauer, Chillicothe high school instructor, was the speaker Monday night before the Christian Men's Fellowship of First Christian church, West Water street.

Mr. Sauer, the son of a Methodist missionary, was born in Korea and lived there until the age of 15 when the Japanese forced missionaries from the country.

After getting his advanced education in the United States and serving with the armed forces, Mr. Sauer returned to Korea as a teacher. Again he was forced to flee, this time by the outbreak of fighting in Korea.

Speaking of life and conditions in the land of his birth, Mr. Sauer expressed confidence that Korea will develop into a progressive nation, if given the chance. He spoke highly of the Koreans, with their many burdens and hardships.
