

### ST. MARY'S CLASS PLAY ENTHUSIASTICALLY RECEIVED BY BIG AUDIENCE TUESDAY EVE

**"A Lucky Break" Three Act Comedy Play Given by Members of the Senior Class—Under Splendid Direction of Walter J. Breen—All Members of the Cast Portray Their Roles in Fine Manner.**

The members of the senior class of the Central Catholic High School appeared Tuesday evening in a most enjoyable comedy play, "A Lucky Break" and each member of the cast, fourteen in all acquitted themselves in a manner most creditable. The play, by Zola Fears, produced by special arrangements with Longness Owen Company was full of clever and witty sayings and was not too long. Although the players deserve high commendation for their fine presentation, a large measure of the credit for the great success of the play goes to Mr. Walter J. Breen, capable director.

The school auditorium was filled to capacity for the performance and preceding the play and between the acts the music of St. Mary's school orchestra was heard.

Briefly the story concerns the fortune of John Bruce, wealthy citizen, who after an absence of twenty years returns to the Connecticut village of his boyhood, where he is best on all sides by "friends" asking favors. The scene of the play is laid in the office of Hotel Muller, Massachussetts, where the entire three acts take place. Mr. Bruce, suspecting that his money is the cause of his popularity permits a rumor that he has lost his fortune in Wall street to go unheeded, believing that this will show his friends in their true colors. After many multi-provoking difficulties, the play leads to a happy ending for all concerned.
