The opening day schedule Friday, with activities starting at 6 p.m., includes a parade (pets and bicycles); introduction of queen contestants; review of Bologna Festival history and introduction of former queens and attendants; crowning of the 1976 queen, and a concluding square dance, featuring the Rhythm Drifters.

Saturday's activities will begin at 11 a.m., with a big wheel race and other games, such as sack race, egg toss, crackers and bubble gum, three-legged race, marshmallow race, wheelbarrow race and frisbee.

After that will be weaving at the Country Store; a baking contest; a parade and introduction of visiting queens, and a performance by the Justice Family on the main stage.

Once again, activities will conclude with the Rhythm Drifters performing for a square dance.

Sunday's program will open with Thunderchicken, followed by a water fight between the volunteer firemen, a concert by the Adelphi Community Band and the Crusaders, and a hot air balloon demonstration.

On Monday, rides will be offered for \$2 from 1 to 4 p.m. There will be a pinewood derby at the town hall, a beard contest, a parade of old dresses and drawings for money and bicycles. The Rapid Forge, a rock group, will wind up activities with a performance at 8 p.m.

There will be a fish booth and a Country Store. All proceeds from the festival will be used to improve the volunteer fire department.
