## Moonshine Festival slated

Local entertainers, craftsmen and amusement seekers will gather in New Straitsville May 26 to 30 for the town's seventh annual Moonshine Festival.

Children may take all rides 6 to 10 p.m. May 26 for \$2. At 7 p.m. the 1977 Miss Moonshine candidates will be introduced followed by the Little Miss Moonshine candidates at 8 p.m.

The festival will open officially at 6:30 p.m. May 27, Queens Day. The Senior Citizen High Rise Jamboree will perform at 7 p.m. and coronation of the 1977 Miss Moonshine will follow. The Country Roads and Honky Tonks will give a street dance and show 8 p.m. to midnight.

Activities on Kid's Day, May 28, will begin when the Falling Angels, four skydivers, land on Main Street.

Games and contests for children will be at 1 p.m., including a balloon toss at 2 p.m. and the first part of a talent contest at 2:30 p.m. The Falling Angels will perform at 2:15, 4:30, and 6 p.m., and Marko the Magician and Tarbaby the Clown will give a show at 3:30 p.m.

A decorated pet and bicycle contest will be at 5 p.m., followed by another Falling Angels performance and the 1977 Little Queens and Firemens parade.

The 1977 Little Miss Moonshine and her court will be crowned at 6:30 p.m. and The Bob Gallion and Patti Powell Show will follow. A street dance to the music of Gene Mathias and the Justice Family will be at 8 p.m. and Gallion and Miss Powell will perform again at 9:30 p.m. The evening will conclude with a street dance from 10:30 p.m. to midnight.

May 29 is Old Fashioned Day and Clarence Cordial Day beginning at noon with a costume and beard contest followed by a sing-a-long at 12:30 p.m. At 2 p.m. the Gospel Echoes will perform and Marko the Magician and Tarbaby the Clown will give a show at 3:30 p.m.

Kenny Yahn and the Country Knights will provide music until 6:30 p.m., followed by an Old Fashioned Fiddlers contest. The day's activities will end with a street dance 8 p.m. to midnight to the music of Frog and the Greenhorns.

May 30, Parade Day and Tom Boyle Day, begins with a noon performance by a baton corps. Bindy will perform at 1 and 3 p.m., and visiting Ohio Festival Queens will be presented at 1:45 p.m.

The 1977 Moonshine Festival Grand Parade will begin at 3 p.m.

The Adelphi Community Band will give a concert at 4:15 p.m. and the second part of the talent show will be at 5:15 p.m.

The festival will come to a close with a street dance until 10 p.m. to the music of Rated X.
