

## Moonshine Festival Opens Friday

The fifth annual New Straitsville Moonshine Festival is slated to open Friday with four action-filled days to conclude on Monday, Memorial Day. Actually, activities will begin on Thursday, which has been designated as "Preview Day," and all rides will be featured from 8 to 10 p.m. for \$2 per person. Judging of Little Miss Moonshine contestants will begin at 8:30 p.m., followed by formal wear judging of Miss Moonshine at 7:30 p.m.

Friday will be "Queen's Day." Activities will begin at 8:30 p.m. Crowning of the 1975 Miss Moonshine and her court is scheduled for 7 p.m. The new queen will be crowned by the reigning Miss Moonshine, Wilma Kincaid of Hickock. Exotic dancing will follow the coronation at 7:30. Ray an Marler and the Star Valley Boys will provide music for street dancing, starting at 8 p.m.

Saturday will be "Kids Day." Activities will be kicked off at noon with a pet and bicycle parade to feature the Miller High School Band, Sassy Q's, Glouster Twirlettes, past Little Misses, pets and decorated bicycles. Games and contests, such as apple dip, sack races and pie eating contests, will start at 1 p.m., followed by a frog jumping contest at 2, and the Little Moby Jo show at 2:30 p.m. Filippo the Clown from Channel 10's Early Show will perform at 3, and there will be a puppet show at 4.

ertainment at 5:30. Evening's entertainment will begin at 6 with a three-hour country and western show, the Red Wilson Show, featuring Ethel Delaney and her Buckeye Strings, Rod Wilson, Dixie Brady and the Ohio Promenaders. Street dancing will follow to the music of the Country Beaver and the Rhythm Drifters. A carnival matures from 1 to 4 p.m., again will offer all rides for \$2 per person.

Sunday will be "Old-Fashioned Day." Everyone is asked to worship at any of the seven area churches. The Songmen will sing at 1 p.m., followed by an old-fashioned sing-along at 2 p.m. Family entertainment is scheduled for 3, and Part 1 of the amateur talent contest will get underway at 4 p.m., with some 30 acts scheduled. The Tipple Family will perform at 7 p.m., and street dancing will be to music of the Country Beaver and the Rhythm Drifters.

Monday will be "Parade Day." Entertainment will begin at noon. The Harriman Family will perform at 1 p.m., and presentation of the visiting festival queens will begin at 2 p.m. The big parade, a highlight of the festivities, will begin at 3 p.m., dedicated to the memory of the late

Thomas H. Boyle. The parade will feature unicycles, bands, drill teams, baton groups, horses, antique cars, floats, Skions and other entries. The Adelphi Community Band will present a concert at 4 p.m., followed by Part 2 of the talent contest at 4:30. Street dancing to the music of Mirror will round out the four-day festival.

The State Department of Liquor Control will have a moonshine still on display. The Brush Marks will have an art display, and downtown shop windows will be filled with interesting displays for the four-day festival.

Did you ever hear of Moonshine Pie? It will be sold each of the four days, and there will be food booths and other civic booths.

Robinson's Cave, the birthplace of the United Mine Workers of America, will be available for sightseeing.

All amateur talent is eligible to enter the Talent Show. All acts must be registered. Prizes will be \$50 for first place, \$25 for second place and \$10 for third place winners.

To pre-register call 284-2917. There will be a record player, but contestants must bring their own props necessary for the act.

Judges will be radio MC's and professional dancers or actors. Participants are asked to be in the stage area ready to check in no later than 2:30 p.m. Sunday.
