************* ************ THE COMMUNITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH WAS DEDICATED JUNE 7, L896, AS THE HALLSVILLE METHODIST CHURCH. IT WAS ERECTED ON LAND DONATED BY MRS. DAVID (JOANNA BUCHWALTER) JONES AND HAS SINCE SERVED AS A PLACE OF WORSHIP FOR RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNITY.

TWENTY-NINE MINISTERS HAVE SERVED THIS PAR-ISH, INCLUDING THE PRESENT PASTOR, THE REV. MR. DAVID TITLER, WHO HAS MINISTERED TO THE CONGREGATION FOR THE PAST EIGHTEEN YEARS. THE CHURCH HAS A MEMBERSHIP OF SEVENTY-SEVEN, WITH AN AVERAGE WEEKLY ATTENDANCE OF SIXTY-FIVE.

FLOWERS WILL BE PLACED TODAY ON THE GRAVES OF FOUR VETERANS OF THE WAR OF 1812: ZEDE-KIAH DAWSON, MARTIN DRESBACH, HENRY JONES, MOSES JONES; THREE SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR VETERANS: SAMUEL KARSHNER, GORDON WITHROW, AND EBENEZER SPEAKMAN, IN ADDITION TO FIFTY-TWO CIVIL WAR VETERANS AND ONE HUNDRED TEN MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED DURING WORLD WARS I, II, AND THE KOREAN CONFLICT.
