Second Bologna Festival opens with queen crowning

Fifteen-year-old Drena Hinton became queen of Adelphi's second annual Bologna Festival Friday.

Miss Hinton, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Hinton, Adelphi, was crowned during the opening day of the festival by Lisa Hauginn, the 1972 queen.

First runnerup in this year's queen contest was Louisa Holbrook, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Moyer, Route 1, Laurelville, and the second runnerup was Diana Hettinger, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Hettinger of Adelphi.

Chosen as little king and queen for the festival this year were Andrew Delong, 5, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dallas Delong, Route 1, Laurelville, and Dejah Barard, 5, daughter of Mrs. Debra Barard, Adelphi.

Raymond McNeal, one of the festival organizers, said the

first day program was a success in spite of rain weather. A heavy rain about 9 p.m. stopped most of the first night activities, he said.

A crowd estimated at 2,000 attended the first day program, which included, in addition to the queen contest and the little king and queen contest, a parade about five city blocks long.

Another parade is planned as the main feature of today's program. It will begin at 6 p.m. Other activities planned for today include a musical program by Pat Corcoran at 2 p.m., a concert by the Zane Trace High School Band at 3:30 p.m., the Wright Family musical group at 7 p.m., and a square dance on the village square beginning at 9:30 p.m.

The Dewey Ringhiser musical group, Lancaster, will provide music for the square dance.

On Sunday, activities will begin at 1 p.m., with a garden tractor pulling contest near the village hall. The tractor pull will last until about 4 p.m.

The World Action Singers will provide a program of gospel music beginning at 6 p.m., and the Cheryl Carr folk singing group will perform at 7:30.

On Monday, the final day of the festival, Pine Ridge and the Kustom Four will open the day's activities with a program of mixed types of music. Little Jerry Sally, backed up by the Pine Ridge group, will perform at 4:30, and a concert by the Adelphi Community Band will cap off the planned activities at 5:30.

Carnival rides, food stands and games will be available for the balance of the evening Monday, as they have been every day during the festival.
