

4-Day Run Starts Friday

New Straitsville Primed For 4th Moonshine Festival

New Straitsville is primed for its 6th annual Moonshine Festival, with four action-packed days to start Friday and run through Monday, Memorial Day.

Rides and games will be provided by Kissel Bros. Amusement Co. of Cincinnati. An expanded midway will be set up, with at least nine rides and from 25 to 35 games and shows.

Again this year, visitors can see an authentic moonshine still display, including photos, confiscated stills, a homemade replica and an explanation of the operations by an Ohio Department of Liquor Control moonshine still squad.

There also will be an art display by several local artists, craft booths, booths by civic organizations, food, souvenirs, window displays, rides furnished by the Hocking Valley Scenic Railway, plus tours of Robinson's Cave — the birthplace of the United Mine Workers.

Special treats offered at no other festival in the state will be Moonshine Pie (made from a secret recipe) and Moonshine Sno-Cones.

The festival actually will begin Thursday, designated as Preview Day. Kids can ride all carnival rides as many times as they wish for \$2.

Preliminary judging of Moonshine Queen and Little Queen contestants will be conducted.
