Memorial Day was initiated May 3, 1868, by General John Logan, Commander-in-Chief of the Grand Army of The Republic, a veterans' association organized after the Civil War. Locally, the day was first observed in 1870, eleven years before it became a legal holiday. Services were first held on the lawn of the local cemetery. In the early 1900's, the service was moved to a community hall, the present site of the veterans' group home in this small town. Beginning in 1910, the observance became church-centered, with services held at one of the two village churches, alternating annually.

Today, as in past years, the Adelphi Band will lead a procession to the Hallsville Cemetery, with veteran Gale Kyle bearing the flag. Lowell Swepston will place a wreath at the Soldiers' Monument. The service will conclude appropriately with the playing of "Taps."
