The Buddy Poppy is a different poppy from that usually sold, because it is the personal handiwork of a disabled veteran who is paid for that labor and who is thus helped to make a livelihood.

The Buddy Poppy is sold to create a fund to help care for disabled veterans who are outside of institutions and whose needs are greater now than ever before.

The sale in Chillicothe this year is under the auspices of Theodore Roosevelt Auxiliary of the V. F. W., with Mrs. Louis G. Knost as chairman. The Poppies will be sold all day to a generous public and the response should be in keeping with the worthy cause which called it into being.
