Reminders of the services to the country by veterans of all wars will be set forth by Memorial Day activities throughout the county Saturday.

Focal point of the activities will be a joint service at the National Guard Armory in Yocangee Park at 1:30 p.m., sponsored by the Central Memorial committee. S. V. Westerberg, associate warden of the Federal Reformatory, will be the speaker and the Chillicothe High School band will play.

- Greenlawn Cemetery, by Spanish War Veterans and Daughters of Union Veterans, 10:30 a.m.
- St. Margaret's Cemetery, by Gen. E. F. Glenn Post 108 and DAV Post 18, 10:30 a.m.
- Veterans' Hospital, 10:30 a.m.

In the county, Frankfort American Legion Post 483 and the Legion Auxiliary will have a service at 10:30 a.m. in Frankfort Greenlawn Cemetery.

In Hallsville, a 10 a.m. service is planned at the Hallsville Methodist Church, Route 180, with the Rev. Charles Lusher of the Tabernacle Baptist Church as speaker. Vocal music will be by Mrs. Jack Nusbaum. The Adelphi Band will play at the church and lead a procession to the Hallsville Cemetery, where it will play at Memorial Circle while children decorate soldiers' graves.

The observance will be in connection with the Hallsville Civil War Post, named for Capt. Luther Buchwalter, Co. A, 73rd Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry.

East Main May Be 'Great White Way'

East Main Street, from the viaduct east to the Route 35 bypass, may become one of the best lighted streets in Chillicothe.

Reporting on street lights at a caucus session Wednesday night, City Manager B. J. Stacey said recommendations of the Columbus & Southern Ohio Electric Company for lighting on East Main Street call for 27 mercury vapor lights the length of the street.

The lights, erected on metal standards, would provide 25,000 lumens where most areas along the street now have 8,000 lumens.
