## 14th Annual Festival Next Week

# Old Car Show Set

Kaiser, Tucker, Packard, Hudson, DeSoto and Henry J... automobiles from days gone by.

These names may bring back memories of your childhood, memories of your first car or... for those young enough... no memories at all.

Whatever the case may be, Saturday, June 4 and Sunday, June 5 the Lancaster Old Car Club Inc. will make those memories come alive with its 14th annual Spring Festival on the Fairfield County Fairgrounds.

Cars of all shapes and sizes will converge on the fairgrounds for the two-day event.

### Across Country

According to co-chairman Edison DeVore, antique and classic autos from all parts of the country will be on display during the annual festival.

The vehicles will be judged in 31 classes with 99 trophies going to the winners.

DeVore says: "Last year we had over 400 vehicles from all parts of the country on display."

These autos range from the more familiar antique autos to rare, no longer produced classic vehicles.

Old cars are not the only feature of this year's festival.

### Large Flea Market

One of the largest flea markets in the area will also be in operation. At last year's festivities, DeVore says over 160 flea market dealers participated.

The Adelpi Old Timers Band will be presenting shows throughout the festival. It is the oldest band in Ohio.

Also on the grounds will be the Hocking Valley Steam and Antique Power Club display. It features antique steam engines, old farm equipment and antique gasoline engines.

A recently added, but very popular feature — the Saturday antique auto auction — will again highlight this year's festival.

H. M. Nestor and Associates will be offering antique and classic cars of all types for sale. The auction will begin at 10:59 a.m.

DeVore noted for those wishing to sell cars at the auction: all cars must be on the grounds by 9 a.m. the day of the sale; there is a \$30 registration fee and a six per cent sales commission; and cars will be sold on a first come, first serve basis.

### Parking Fee

While admission to the festival remains free, this year the Old Car Club has been forced to levy a \$1 per car parking charge.

"Inflation is just catching up with us," says DeVore, "and while we hate to have to charge, we are at least keeping it to a minimum."

The Ohio Wing of the Civil Air Patrol will be providing security for the antique autos, directing traffic and will be operating an information booth.

Radio station WHOK-FM will broadcast from the fairgrounds both days. Worship services will be held at 9:45 a.m. Sunday.

DeVore says the Old Car Club hopes its thousands of old friends, who have made the festival so successful, and many new ones will find their way to grounds next weekend for a free peek at a time gone by.
