

TWIN HOLIDAY LOOMS FOR CIVIL WAR VET

Memorial Day Also To Be 98th Birthday Of Nelson J. Dunlap; Short Services Planned In City

Memorial Day will be occasion for double celebration for Mr. Nelson J. Dunlap, because, not only is he one of Ross County's last two survivors of the Civil War, but also because he will be 98 years old Friday.

Mr. Dunlap, who has been ill recently, will be visited at about 3 p. m. by a group of uniformed Spanish-American and World War veterans, together with U. S. Army men now at home on furlough. All the uniformed men will be from Kingston and vicinity.

Form Honor Court

A court of honor will be formed by the men in uniform and a floral tribute will be presented to Mr. Dunlap. Music will be furnished by the Adelphi band.

After the tribute, the group, accompanied by the band, will proceed to Mt. Pleasant cemetery for memorial services.

Members of the Chillicothe American Legion will have charge of the services there, with the Rev. L. V. Bougass acting as chaplain. Mr. F. N. R. Redfern, Adelphi, will be the speaker.

The address will be followed by the firing of a salute by the American Legion firing squad, after which taps will be sounded.

All veterans' graves have been supplied with new bronze markers and an American flag.

Mr. Nicholas Scholl, 97, 113 East Fifth street, the county's other surviving Civil War veteran, has made no plans for Memorial Day, according to his son, Mr. Albert Scholl, who explained that any activities he may engage in will depend up how he feels when he arises.

Two Services Here

Solemn simplicity, as befits the occasion, will mark the local observance of Memorial Day. Two ritualistic services will be conducted, at 10:30 a. m. in Greenlawn cemetery and at 10:35 a. m. at the Soldiers Monument in city park.


The service at Greenlawn cemetery will be conducted by the United Spanish War Veterans. Attersey John E. Bliss will be the speaker.

Showers Forecast

Rainfall May Dampen Memorial Day, Break In Heat Indicated

Chillicotheans awakened again Thursday and had the weatherman's promise that showers might spoil outdoor festivities Memorial Day.

Mrs. Alphonse Muller, official weather observer reported that the temperature had risen to 69 at 5 a. m. Thursday after reaching a high of 94 on Wednesday. During the night the mercury dropped to 61. At noon temperatures were still rising and the bright sun failed to give any promise of the rain which may come Thursday night and Friday.

Thermometers hit record-breaking highs throughout the state yesterday.

Cleveland reported a new May 29th record when the mercury climbed to 91. Toledo's 91 was its highest reading of the year. Columbus had 92 as did Cincinnati, where Meteorologist W. C. Devereaux reported a record rainfall deficiency of 10.56 inches since Jan. 1. Previous low for this period was in 1901 when rainfall was 7.63 below normal.
