Subject: the Adelphi Band's "Not a Newsletter" newsletter

Greetings!

Since we are already into May, and there has been no Adelphi Band newsletter yet, I thought I'd provide a brief update via email.

The reason for the delay is the Corona virus and the various restrictions that impact fairs, festivals, and parades. I spoke with Sue Hinton Friday about possible Adelphi Band performance dates, etc. Sue informed me that Glenn was working on a newsletter, but was waiting on a call back from someone before sending it on to me.

I didn't receive any details from Sue, but I will share what I have learned elsewhere. Mostly this information has come from event web sites, newspaper reports, and Face Book posts from the organization.

- The **Hallsville Memorial Day** services have been [cancelled](#) for 2020. This would have been held on 5-25-20.

- The **Pleasant Hill** (?) services on Memorial Day weekend have been [cancelled](#) for 2020.

- For 2020 the **Laurelville Fireman's Festival** was moved from the end of July to the first week in June (3-6). It has since been [cancelled](#) for 2020.

- The **Lancaster Music Festival** has been [cancelled](#) for 2020 (July 23 – August 1). We would normally have played there on Saturday, July 25.

*** At this time the only county fair that has been cancelled is the Marion County Fair, originally scheduled for June 29 through July 4. The Ohio Fair Mangers Association has published that they are in communication with the Governor's office about how to hold a fair while observing cautions on gathering size and social distancing. Marion County said they couldn't wait any longer, citing deadlines for negotiating contracts. For those keeping score at home, there are 4 county fairs prior to Marion County's: Paulding, Pickaway, Putnam and Harrison.

That brings you up to date on what I know for now. As soon as Glenn gets the newsletter to me I will send it on as soon as possible.
