## LOCAL HISTORY

For a number of years, Methodists of the Hellsville community worshipped in the local United Brethren Church, holding services there every other Sunday. In 1896, under the pastorate of one Rev. Mr. Brown, the present Hallsville Community Church was erected. Dedicated June 7, 1896, it became a part of the Adelphi charge. The first minister of this charge was Z. W. Facan (in 1900).

The church was repaired and rededicated in April, 1937. A basement was added (1950-52). More recent improvements were made in 1989 when a new belfrey and vestibule were built. Furnace, sidewalks, and air conditioning were additional results of the combined physical and spiritual strengths of a dedicated and greatly appreciated volunteer work force.
