

Hospital marking 100 years

This month, Medical Center
Hospital will kick off a seven-month
celebration in recognition of the
hospital's 100th birthday.
The June 25 celebration will
recreate one of the hospital's first
fundraisers and rededicate the facility. On June 27, 1895, the Chillicothe Emergency Hospital was incorporated, accepting its first patient in early 1896. During the first
"Fare Day," the women's auxiliary raised money for the hospital
by serving as conductors on the
Chillicothe Street Railway. All fares
collected that day were donated to
the hospital.
The 1995 Fair Day will begin at
noon Sunday, June 25, with a hog
calling contest, followed by a
wheelbarrow race, pie-eating and
watermelon-seed spitting contests,
a three-legged race, a waterballoon toss and a white elephant

The Adelphi Band will perform at 1:30 p.m. and the Great Seal Band will perform at 4 p.m. Fair Day will conclude with the Kingston Kickers and line dancing at 5 p.m. All events are free and open to the public

Local artisans will also be at the event displaying their crafts and items that commemorate the 100th birthday of the hospital.
